Chapter Volunteer Day

These career-enhancing certifications allow the people who hold them to be recognized globally by their security industry peers. Manning Fund

As I wrote in prior newsletters, the Chapter Board has been working with the ASIS Foundation Board to review the policies and procedures for the Manning Fund. The aim of the Foundation is to coordinate and standardize ASIS International scholarship activity in all chapters. A review by the legal staff of the Foundation Board discovered that some practices engaged in by chapters could place the non-profit status of the Foundation in question. Our chapter's Manning Funds are administered under the ASIS Foundation's 501 (c) (3) status.

Fund History

I would like to start by providing some history and financial data on the Manning Fund. In honor of the memory of John P. Manning, the 1976 Boston Chapter Chair and a lifelong supporter of ASIS International, an endowment

fund was created in 1992. That year, Boston Chapter Life Member John P. O'Neill led a team that solicited \$142,242 in contributions from individuals and corporations.

Financial Data

Ninety-five percent of the Manning Fund Scholarship contributions are held by the ASIS Foundation. The \$142,242 corpus of the Manning Fund, which was collected in 1992, is held in a permanently restricted account. This money can't be used for scholarships, but the interest created by these funds can be transferred to a second Manning account and used for scholarships.

A second ASIS Foundation Manning Fund account containing \$38,871 is a temporarily restricted account and can be used for scholarships. Scholarship checks are distributed from this account.

There is a third Manning Fund account which the Boston Chapter has at Citizens Bank where the funds we collect during the year are held. Scholarship checks are also distributed from this account. The current balance on that account is \$3,355.

Going Forward

Now that we have concluded our work, I would like to outline important aspects of the Manning Fund Scholarship.

- The application time line for the Manning Scholarships will be from February 1 to April 30 each year.
- The Boston Chapter Board will make recommendations for scholarship recipients, which will then be approved by the ASIS Foundation Board. The scholarship recipients will be chosen in June.

- Applicants must be a member or a relative of a member in good standing of the Boston Chapter.
- The scholarship will be used for study to advance educational goals of the applicant and may include academic study at a university, college or community college, as well as be applied to earning ASIS Certifications or to pay for official ASIS International education courses. All scholarships awarded as Manning Fund Scholarships will support educational goals to help advance the applicant's professional achievement in the security and related professions.
- The ASIS Foundation has recommended awarding a maximum of five percent of the funds as scholarships on an annual basis.
- Gifts to nonprofit organizations will not be allowed.

ASIS Foundation CPP Accelerator Scholarship

I hope you saw my emails about the ASIS Foundation CPP Accelerator Scholarship. Members of the Boston Chapter who are interested in taking the CPP Certification Exam should apply. The ASIS Foundation is offering all ASIS Chapters the gift of a free CPP certification exam to award to one member of the chapter. To apply for this scholarship, in addition to being a member in good standing of the Boston Chapter, you must meet the eligibility

requirements necessary to take the CPP Certification Exam. The deadline for submission is December 10, 2018.

Sheldon Goodman Award

During his professional life, Sheldon Goodman, CPP, exemplified what an ASIS member should be. He attended virtually every meeting of the Boston Chapter, was quick to speak to a newcomer, and vigorously invited others to attend meetings. 

COMMITTED TEAMS: THREE
STEPS TO INSPIRING PASSION
AND PERFORMANCE

In the crowded world of books about teaming, there is still room for a definitive guide about robust and resilient teams. *Committed Teams* fills the gap by presenting a provocative book about a wide spectrum of topics regarding the complex process of team-building.

The authors know this material very well and they offer much-needed tools, such as a diagnostic checklist to navigate the process. Authors Moussa, Boyer, and Newberry observed over 100 teams in Wharton's Executive Development Program. They saw what worked and what didn't and distilled that information into a process for becoming a superior team leader and team player and reviewed the components and creation of teams in an easy-to-understand fashion. The reader is taken step-by-step through the issues that merit consideration when developing teaming programs.

One very good contribution that bridges theory and practice is the use of concepts and methods to better understand team dynamics. The topic of team creation is ubiquitous throughout many businesses, yet this book shares the "how-to" of effectual goals, roles and norms, and provides steps for ensuring their resilience over time. This book clearly identifies ways that are immediately operational in a business setting. The authors also offer very practical approaches that the reader can implement quickly and effectively. There are some very good lessons from the authors that can help the reader reach success in many different ways. This book details simple, yet practical, steps that yield results.

Overall, this book was well-researched, well-written, very informative, and a good, one-stop resource for a wide audience. It is an excellent resource for those interested in developing high-performing teams in any organization or industry. Particularly worthwhile to security professionals is the discussion of team building and security trainers will find this text a welcome addition to their instructional tool kit.

on how interactive the crowd was at the event and how the casino format fostered so much social interaction as opposed to a traditional sit-down dinner.

I want to express my gratitude to the following members who joined me on the 60th Anniversary Planning Committee: Bonnie Michelman; Marty Patnaude Riley; Craig McQuate; Paul Baratta; and Bob Nicol. We could not have been as successful as we were without the hard work of these volunteer committee members.

The Chapter Board decided in 2017 that we would replace the annual golf tournament with the party to celebrate our 60th anniversary as the main generator of Manning Fund revenue. The \$2,380 we raised at the 60th Anniversary Celebration represents a 50 percent increase over the average amount of scholarship monies raised during the last three years of the golf tournament. I want to thank all those who donated so generously that night.

Chapter Volunteer Leadership History 1958 -2018

I would like to end my message by saluting those who have preceded us as volunteer leaders on the Chapter Board. The dedication of the men and women who over the past 60 years founded and sustained the vitality of one of the most important chapters in ASIS International is awe-inspiring.

I reviewed the Chapter leadership history for the past six decades and found an amazing similarity. Almost all of the volunteer leaders served in all four board positions, ie. secretary, treasurer, vice chair, and chair. A significant number of members served more than once in these positions.

One hundred fourteen men and women have served on the ASIS Boston board during the past 60 years. I find it a sign of the vitality of the Chapter that since the year 2000, the participation of women has grown to represent 32 percent of the new members elected to the board.

I want to recognize the outstanding leadership service of the 114 male and female board members by listing their names below. I have listed only the first year that these volunteer leaders were elected to the Chapter board.
